

# LBIC Selection Guide

infinityPV light beam induced current (LBIC) systems enable ultrafast high-resolution mapping of the photovoltaic response of solar cells over very large areas from single cells through modules, large panels and long rolls of solar cells.

We offer LBIC systems that bridge all scales of cost and complexity. There are 3 overall platforms: academic, professional and industrial. Scan areas range from 50 x 50 mm<sup>2</sup> and up to many square meters or rolls that are hundreds of meters long. Wavelengths in the range of 400-1200 nm are typically used while supercontinuum-, UV- and far IR-laser sources can also be employed.
